

1st Grade - Fiction Literacy Fair Guide

Welch's literacy fair is designed to promote the love of reading. We encourage students to pick a book that they enjoyed reading and would recommend to a friend. Our hope is after student's see all the fantastic displays they will have a list of books they can't wait to read.

Project Guidelines

- Select a book the child can read independently or with little help.
- The following information should be on the trifold along with labels to identify each section
 - o Title
 - o Author
 - o Main character- drawing/ picture with a 2 or more sentence description
 - o Setting - drawing/picture with a 2 or more sentences description
 - o Sequence - drawing/picture of the beginning, middle and ending of the story. Under each picture a 1-3 sentence description
 - o Favorite part - Picture of their favorite part of the story and a sentence telling why it was their favorite.
 - o Student's and teacher's name should be written on the **back** of the trifold.
- All artwork and writing should be completed by the student.
- *Project Design:* All projects must be on a tri-fold project board that unfolds to be no larger than 36" H x 48" W. Storyboards should be colorful and interesting. The sentences on the board should be in the child's handwriting. Typed or cut out letters can be used for the titles and labels.
- *Due Date:* All projects are due in the gym by 8:20 AM on February 16, 2017.
- Judging will take place during the day on the 16th. Students and their families will be able to see the winning projects during the M.R.E. event that evening. All projects will be on display with award ribbons from 5:30 - 7:00 p.m.
- Projects are due on February 16th, 2017. Students will be called down during the day to set up their display.

Other items which can be added to make the trifold more appealing:

Borders around pictures or labels

Background paper

Pre-cut letters

Attaching or displaying objects which were important to the story

Ex: wand, bowl of soup, honey, stuffed animal

1st grade fiction checklist

Use the checklist below to make sure you have all the sections on your tri-fold

- Title
- Author
- Main character(s): drawing/ picture with a 2 or more sentence description
- Setting - drawing/picture with a 2 or more sentences description
- Sequence - drawing/picture of the beginning, middle and ending of the story.
Under each picture a 1-3 sentence description
- Favorite part - Picture of their favorite part of the story and a sentence telling why it was their favorite.

Project Guidelines

- **Select a book the child can read independently or with little help.**

 - o **Facts- picture/drawing with at least a 2 sentence description of the fact (s)**
 - o **Sequence or Time Line - drawing/picture of at least 3 things that happened in the correct order. Under each picture one or more sentences describing what occurred.**
 - o **Student's and teacher's name should be written on the back of the trifold.**
- **All artwork and writing should be completed by the student.**

- *Project Design:* **All projects must be on a tri-fold project board that unfolds to be no larger than 36" H x 48" W. Storyboards should be colorful and interesting. The sentences on the board should be in the child's handwriting. Typed or cut out letters can be used for the titles and labels.**
- *Due Date:* **All projects are due in the gym by 8:20 AM on February 16, 2017.**
- **Judging will take place during the day on the 16th. Students and their families will be able to see the winning projects during the M.R.E. event that evening. All projects will be on display with award ribbons from 5:30 - 7:00 p.m.**

- **Other items which can be added to make the trifold more appealing:**
 - Borders around pictures or labels**
 - Background paper**
 - Pre-cut letters**
 - Attaching or displaying objects which were important to the topic**
 - Ex: pictures, maps, sport equipment**

1st grade non-fiction checklist

Use the checklist below to make sure you have all the sections on your tri-fold

- Title
- Author
- Sequence or Timeline - A drawing/picture and one or more sentences describing the beginning, middle, and ending of the person's life or subject of the book.
- Facts - drawing/pictures of two facts you learned while reading the book. Each fact should have 2 or more handwritten sentences.
- Student's and teacher's name is written on the back of the trifold.

Did you do most of the project yourself?

Make sure you know enough about your book that you are able to talk to the judges. You will be called down during the day to talk about your project with them.
