

Fiction Literacy Fair Guide

Welch's literacy fair is designed to promote the love of reading. We encourage students to pick a book they enjoyed reading and would recommend to a friend. Our hope is after student's see all the fantastic displays they will have a list of books they can't wait to read.

Project Guidelines

- **Select a book the child can read independently or with little help.**
- **The following information should be on the project along with labels to identify each section**
 - o **Title**
 - o **Author**
 - o **Main character(s): drawing/picture and a 3 or more sentence description which includes at least two character traits**
 - o **Setting: drawing/ picture and a 3 or more sentence description**
 - o **Problem: 3 or more sentences describing the problem in the story**
 - o **Solution: 2 or more sentences explaining how the problem was solved**
 - o **Question: What is a question you would ask the author?**
 - o **Student's and teacher's name should be written on the back of the trifold.**
- **All artwork and writing/typing should be completed by the student.**
- *Project Design:* **All projects must be on a tri-fold project board that unfolds to be no larger than 36" H x 48" W. Storyboards should be colorful and interesting. The sentences on the board should be in the child's handwriting. Typed or cut out letters can be used for the titles and labels.**
- *Due Date:* **All projects are due in the gym by 8:20 AM on February 16, 2017.**
- **Judging will take place during the day on the 16th. Students and their families will be able to see the winners during the M.R.E. event that evening. All projects will be on display with award ribbons from 5:30 - 7:00 p.m.**
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Other items which can be added to make the trifold more appealing:

Borders around pictures or labels

Background paper

Pre-cut letters

Attaching or displaying objects which were important to the story

Ex: wand, bowl of soup, honey, stuffed animal

3-5th checklist

Use the checklist below to make sure you have all the sections on your tri-fold

- Title
- Author
- Main character(s): drawing/picture and a 3 or more sentence description which includes at least two character traits
- Setting: drawing/ picture and a 3 or more sentence description
- Problem: 3 or more sentences describing the problem in the story
- Solution: 2 or more sentences explaining how the problem was solved
- Question: What is a question you would ask the author?
- Student's and teacher's name should be written on the **back** of the trifold.

Is your project legible, colorful, and exciting to look at?

Did you complete the written and drawing part with little or no help?

Make sure you know enough about your book that you are able to talk to the judges. You will be called down during the day to talk about your project with them.

Project Guidelines

 - o **2 Facts- drawing/picture and at least 3 sentences explaining each fact (s)**
 - o **Wow - drawing/picture and at least 2 sentences or questions about something in the story that made you say wow!**
 - o **Sequence or Time Line - Drawings/Pictures of at least 4 things that happened in the correct order. Under each picture a sentence should describe what occurred.**
 - o **Student's and teacher's name should be written on the back of the trifold.**
- **All artwork and writing should be completed by the student.**
- *Project Design:* **A standard tri-fold project board that unfolds to be no larger than 36" H x 48" W is recommended. Storyboards should be colorful and interesting. The sentences on the board should be in the child's handwriting. Typed or cut out letters can be used for the titles and labels.**
- *Due Date:* **All projects are due in the gym by 8:20 AM on February 16, 2017.**
Judging will take place during the day on the 16th. Students and their families will be able to see the winners during the M.R.E. event that evening. All projects will be on display with ribbons from 5:30 - 7:00 p.m.

Other items which can be added to make the trifold more appealing:

Borders around pictures or labels

Background paper

Pre-cut letters

Attaching or displaying objects which were important to the topic

Ex: pictures, maps, sports equipment

3-5th checklist

- Title
- Author
- 2 Facts- drawing/picture and at least 3 sentences explaining each fact (s)
- Wow - drawing/picture and at least 2 sentences or questions about something in the story that made you say wow!
- Sequence or Time Line - drawings/pictures of at least 4 things that happened in the correct order. Under each picture a sentence should describe what occurred.
- Student's and teacher's name should be written on the back of the trifold.

Is your project legible, colorful, and exciting to look at?
