- If we have funding for transportation, we could provide opportunities for students to go on field trips where they could use the language. Ex: Go to Chinatown with students and their families.



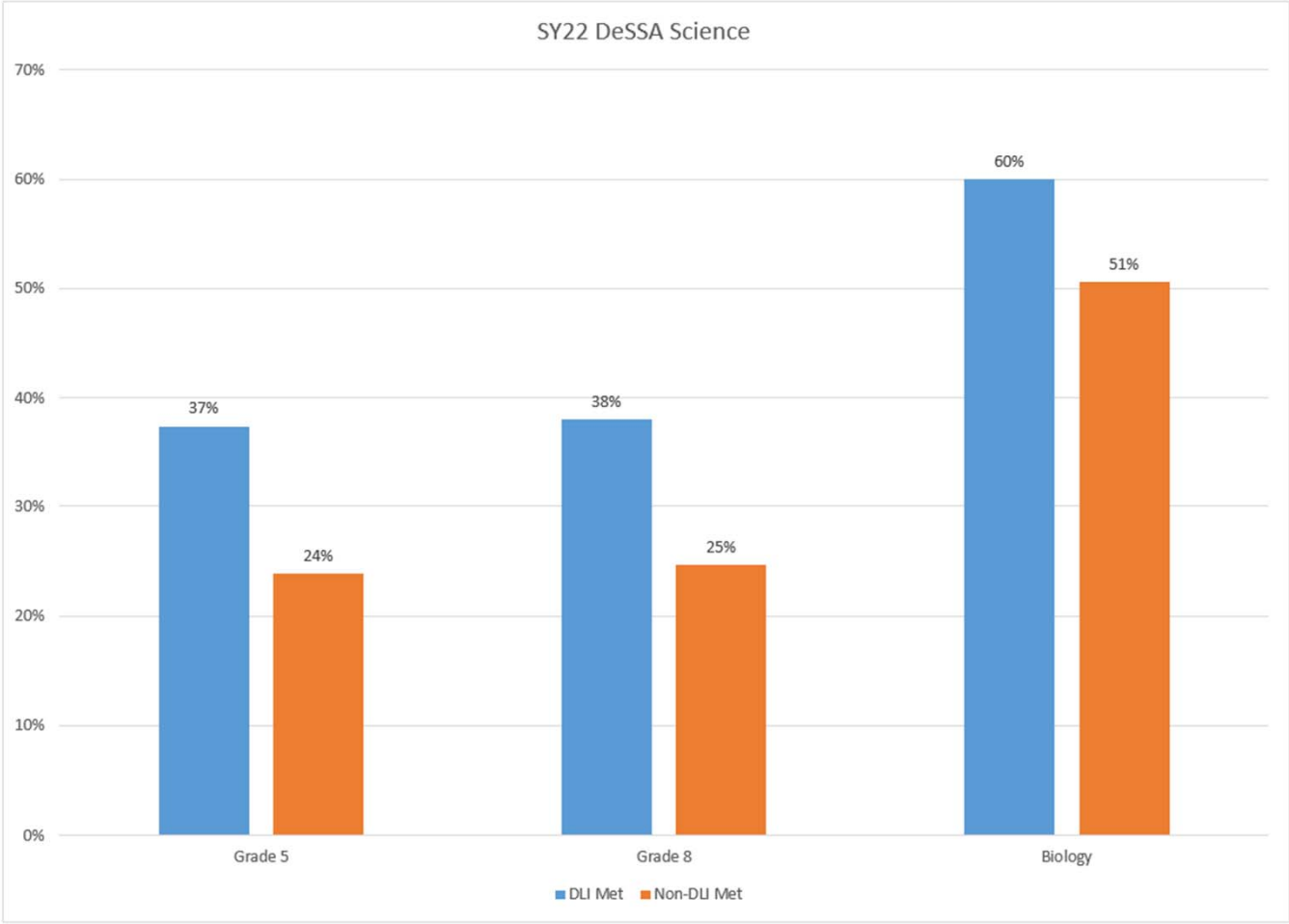

Option 1 for MS

- Keep literacy class and Science in the target language
- Offer Edgenuity to MS who want it over the summer
- Send home quarterly Language Progress Report so parents and students can see how they are progressing toward the end of year language targets instead of assigning a letter grade
- Implement a behavior expectations agreement - Students who have repeated warnings will receive consequences and could be removed from the program (students and teachers will help create the agreement)
- Sign a commitment letter in kindergarten, before grade 3, and before grade 6.



Option 2 for MS

- Keep literacy class and Science (Chinese) and Social Studies (Spanish) in the target language
- Offer Edgenuity to MS who want it over the summer
- Send home quarterly Language Progress Report so parents and students can see how they are progressing toward the end of year language targets instead of assigning a letter grade
- Implement a behavior expectations agreement - Students who have repeated warnings will receive consequences and could be removed from the program (students and teachers will help create the agreement)
- Sign a commitment letter in kindergarten, before grade 3, and before grade 6.



Option 3 for MS

- Literacy class only:
 - Reduced class size
 - Reduces # of staff needed
 - Greater focus on culture and literacy
 - Provide Language Proficiency Report on a quarterly basis
 - Offer Edgenuity for those who want it
 - Implement a behavior expectations agreement - Students who have repeated warnings will receive consequences and could be removed from the program (students and teachers will help create the agreement)
 - Sign a commitment letter in kindergarten, before grade 3, and before grade 6.
