- ◆ Provide special needs family support services in coordination with the medical and personnel components of the Exceptional Family Member Program
- ◆ Promote parental involvement in a child's education to better ensure academic success
- ◆ Coordinate education transition related resources and provide school and community points of contact to military families
- ◆ Provide resource materials on local education services from preschool through college
- ◆ Initiate, manage and promote community partnerships and outreach with schools, community helping agencies, and civic groups

AVAILABLE SERVICES

- ◆ Information about local schools (public, private and charter) to incoming military families
- ◆ Partnerships with on-and off-base educational entities
- ◆ Provide local, state and federal resources and information for families of children with special needs
- ◆ Coordinates communication between the command, schools, and community
- ◆ Cultivates relationships with local educators to better serve military students
- ◆ Facilitates programs in schools aimed at supporting the unique needs and experiences of military students
- ◆ Provides educational opportunities for parents through collaboration with community organizations
- ◆ Provides family support services to military families with special needs

K-12 TRANSITION CHECKLIST

Useful documents to hand carry when transferring schools:

- birth certificate
- social security number
- Immunization record and copy of most recent physical
- Guardianship/custody papers (if applicable)
- Proof of residence (varies)
- Copy of school records (report cards, transcripts, test scores, course descriptions, etc...)
- IEP/IFSP or 504 plans (if applicable)
- ESL or Gifted Education coursework descriptions
- Art and/or writing samples
- Extracurricular activity or sports activity and performance records
- Community service hours
- Academic recognitions
